Course Type	Course Level	Intended Rigor	Course View	Lesson Structure	Student Profile
Foundation	High School	Development	Course Player	35 lessons per part; four parts per course	Students who require structured delivery of lesson content with fewer lessons and assessments. This course type is ideal for students who perform below grade level or need special services.
Competency <small>NCAA</small>	High School	Proficient	Course Player	45 lessons per part; four parts per course	Students who are self-motivated and can work independently to explore lesson content in more detail. This course type is built as a college preparatory course.
Honors <small>NCAA</small>	High School	Advanced	Course Player	45 lessons per part; four parts per course	Students who are highly motivated or accelerated learners. This course type is ideal for students who are comfortable being challenged.
Credit Recovery	Middle School and High School	Basic	MyDay and Course Player	45 lessons per part; two parts per course	Students who have previously been unsuccessful in a course and need to recover credit.
Project Based <small>NCAA</small>	High School	Proficient	Course Player	45 lessons per part; four parts per course	Students who wish to find real-world applications for their lesson content. This course type is ideal for college-bound students and those who need to demonstrate their knowledge of course content.
Middle School	Middle School	Proficient	MyDay	35–45 lessons per part; four parts per course	Students who are in grades 6–8 and are not in credit recovery courses.

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
